### Ordinance.

AN ORDINANCE changing the name of Cass street to Cass avenue; Second street to Second avenue; Fifth street to Fifth avenue; Sixth street to Sixth avenue.

It is hereby ordained by the people of the City of Detroit:

Section 1 (a) That the name of the street and highway in the City of Detroit, heretofore known as Cass street be and the same is hereby designated and shall hereafter be known as Cass avenue.

(b) That the name of the street and highway in the City of Detroit, heretofore known as Second street be and the same is hereby designated and shall hereafter be known as Second avenue.

(c) That the name of the street and highway in the City of Detroit, heretofore known as Fifth street be and the same is hereby designated and shall hereafter be known as Fifth avenue.

(d) That the name of the street and highway in the City of Detroit, heretofore known as Sixth street be and the same is hereby designated and shall hereafter be known as Sixth avenue.

Sec. 2. This ordinance shall take immediate effect.
