Section 1. That section 1 of An Ordinance entitled "An Ordinance relating to the submission and approval of plats" approved Aug. 1, 1905, be and the same is hereby amended so as to read as follows:

Parties submitting any plat for approval shall accompany the same with an abstract of title, showing that the title to the property which it is proposed to dedicate to the public is in the party or parties proposing to dedicate the same, and no such plat shall be approved unless it be accompanied with a certificate from the Law Department certifying to that effect; and also that said plat is correct in form and execution. When said certificate shall have been so indorsed on said plat, then a true copy of such plat shall be filed in the office of the City Engineer.

Sec. 2. This ordinance shall take 2 immediate effect.
