resurfacing of same and the paving,  
repaving or resurfacing of the area  
of said roadbeds as widened.**

IT IS HEREBY ORDAINED BY THE  
PEOPLE OF THE CITY OF DETROIT:

Section 1. That the Commis-  
sioner of Public Works be and he  
is hereby authorized and directed  
to widen the following roadbeds  
from curb to curb:

Owen—Woodward to Oakland, 26  
to 36 ft.
