Resolved, That the City Treasurer be and he is hereby authorized and directed to accept from G. W. Stevenson (9013), the original amount of Part 3 of assessment levied against "Lots 69 and 70, Block E, Jefferson Park sub. of Jefferson Park Realty Co." for the paving of Piper Blvd. (Roll 2866, Book 8, f. 22), with interest added and cancel penalty: Provided payment is made within 6 months from the date of the adoption of this resolution; and further

**Street Names.**

To the Honorable the Common Council:  
Gentlemen—To your Committee of the Whole was referred the communication from the City Plan Commission, recommending that the name of Breckenridge street, between alley west of Tillman avenue and Twenty-third street, and also the name of Rich street, be changed to Forest avenue west. Your committee finds that the name of Breckenridge street between Fourteenth and Humboldt was changed to Forest avenue, by Ordinance 656-A, and that street signs were also changed on that portion of Breckenridge between Williams and Twenty-third street. Your committee does not concur in the recommendation that Breckenridge between Williams and Twenty-third street and Rich street west of McKinley avenue be changed to Forest avenue, and recommend further that the Department of Public Works be directed to replace Breckenridge street signs on that part of said street extending from Williams avenue to Twenty-third street.

**Street Names.**

To the Honorable the Common Council:  
Gentlemen—To your Committee of the Whole was referred the communication from the Department of Public Works, recommending certain changes in the names of Brinker avenue, Jos. Campau avenue, Six-Mile road, streets lying in territory annexed from Hamtramck Township, etc. Your committee begs to report that said communication was referred to the City Plan Commission, who concur in the recommendations of the above department, with the exception of name of existing Six-Mile road between Maine and Conant, suggesting that name be changed to Jerome instead of Farwell avenue and that Jerome avenue between South street and Jefferson avenue be changed to Reid avenue, also that Worcester avenue be changed to Bortle avenue instead of Bortle Place, as originally recommended. Your committee concurs in the recommendations of the City Plan Commission and recommends that the Corporation Counsel be directed to

prepare the proper ordinance for the changing of the names of the following streets or avenues:

Brinker avenue, Nevada avenue to northerly city limits, to Jos. Campau avenue.

Jos. Campau avenue, Nevada avenue to nly. city limits, to Brinker avenue.

Ferris avenue, VanDyke avenue to G. T. R. R. right of way, to Stockton avenue.

Worcester avenue, VanDyke avenue to Maxwell avenue, Bortle avenue.

A street 86 feet wide, opened from the intersection of Six-Mile road at Conant avenue and a point where the Detroit Terminal R. R. right of way intersects the Six-Mile road east at Maine avenue, to Six-Mile road east.

Six-Mile road east, Maine to Conant avenues, to Jerome avenue.

Jerome avenue, South street to Jefferson avenue, to Reid avenue.

(All of the following streets formerly in territory a part of Hamtramck Township and annexed to the City of Detroit in April, 1921):

Christopher avenue to be changed to St. Aubin avenue.

Cline avenue to Lumkin avenue.

Bertram avenue to Fleming avenue.

Honey avenue to Goddard avenue.

Reynolds avenue to Mackay avenue.

Grandy avenue to Anglin avenue.

Rose avenue to Lantz avenue.

King avenue to Mitchell avenue.

Harrison avenue to Charest avenue.

Danforth avenue to Gallagher avenue.

Resolved, That the Department of Public Works be and is hereby authorized and directed to issue a permit to Louis Muscovitz to install free air line in tight steel box flush with curb in front of 2361 Grand River avenue, south side, 28 feet east of Third street.

Provided, That said work shall be performed under the supervision of the Department of Public Works and in accordance with plans submitted to and approved by said department.

Provided, That no rights in the pub-

lic streets, alleys or other public places shall be considered waived by this permission, which is granted expressly on the condition that said air line and all obstructions in connection therewith shall be removed at the expense of the grantee at any time when so directed by the Common Council, and that the public property affected shall be restored to a condition satisfactory to said department by said grantee at its expense; and further

Provided, That said permit issued by the Department of Public Works is granted with the distinct understanding that in the event of the charter of the City of Detroit being amended in such manner as will provide for the levying of a fee, charge or rental, to be hereafter determined upon, or in the event of an ordinance or resolution being enacted providing for an annual charge or rental for the occupancy of public streets, alleys or other public places, that the grantee will pay said fee, charge or rental provided for in said charter, or ordinance or resolution, and that said grantee does hereby bind himself thereunto and to accept said permit on the conditions hereby imposed, and in the event of said grantee contesting the validity of said charter amendment, ordinance or resolution or of said fee, charge or rental, or upon refusal to pay same, this permit shall immediately become void; and further

Provided, This resolution is revocable at the will, whim or caprice of the Common Council and grantee hereby expressly waives any right to claim damages or compensation for property constructed hereunder or for the removal of same, and further, that grantee acquires no implied or other privileges hereunder not expressly stated herein.
