#### From the City Plan Commission.

To the Honorable the Common Council:

Gentlemen—Acting upon the petition of Otto R. Groves, et al (4966), requesting that Lakepointe avenue be opened from Warren avenue to Harper avenue, referred to this Commission by your Honorable Body, a plan for such opening has been prepared, and the following is offered for your consideration:

The opening of Lakepointe avenue from Warren avenue to the Outer Drive, where not already opened, will give a continuous street from the Detroit River to Harper avenue. It was the opinion of the Commission that such opening will not only benefit the surrounding community, but the city at large by reason of this street being direct and continuous. A number of the property owners affected have signified their consent to such an opening.

In view of the above we recommend that the petition be granted, namely, that the opening of Lakepointe avenue from Warren avenue to the Outer Drive, as shown on attached blueprint, outlined in yellow, Plan No. 463-1.

We also recommend the following for your consideration that in order to give access from Barham avenue to Maryland avenue, that the opening of Southampton avenue

and of Frankfort avenue between these two streets be approved.
