

ORDINANCE NO. 95-B

AN ORDINANCE to amend Chapter 164 of the Compiled Ordinances of the City of Detroit, 1920, by adding thereto a new section to be known as Section 3-(a).

IT IS HEREBY ORDAINED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE CITY OF DETROIT:

Section 1. That an ordinance to amend Chapter 164 of the Compiled Ordinances of the City of Detroit, 1920, be and the same is hereby amended by adding thereto a new section to be known as Section 3-(a).

Sec. 3-(a): It shall be unlawful for any proprietor, lessee or manager of any dance hall or academy, or any person, firm or corporation to permit Marathon dancing, so-called, or endurance dance, in any public dance hall or academy, in the City of Detroit. For the purpose of this ordinance Marathon or endurance dancing shall be defined to be dancing, or dancing contests which depend upon the physical endurance or ability of any one or more persons to dance or attempt to dance longer or farther than any person or persons in said contest.

Sec. 2. This ordinance is hereby declared to be immediately necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health and safety and shall be given immediate effect.

ORDINANCE NO. 104-B

AN ORDINANCE to amend Chapter 131 of the Compiled Ordinances of 1920.

IT IS HEREBY ORDAINED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE CITY OF DETROIT:

Section 1. That an ordinance to amend Chapter 131 of the Compiled Ordinances of 1920, and the same is hereby amended to read as follows:

Sec. 13-A. No goods, wares or merchandise of whatsoever nature shall be sold or offered for sale at auction within the one mile circle: Provided that special leave may be granted by the Common Council for a sale called closing out sales of business within said one-mile circle if the business to be closed out by auction has been located at the place where the sale is to be held for a period of one year or longer, excepting herefrom perishable goods.

Sec. 13-B, to read as follows: This ordinance shall not apply to the sale of goods, wares and merchandise as now provided by law.

Sec. 17. An violation of this ordinance shall be punished by fines as above enumerated; and in the imposition of any fine and costs, the court shall make a further sentence, that, in default of the payment thereof the offender be imprisoned in the Detroit House of Correction or County Jail for any period of time not exceeding ninety days.

Sec. 18. Any person violating the provisions of Sections 17 and 8, of this ordinance shall upon conviction thereof be punished by a fine not to exceed the sum of Five Hundred Dollars (\$500), and in the imposition of any such fine the Court may make a further sentence that in default of the payment thereof the offender be imprisoned in the Detroit House of Correction for any period of time not to exceed ninety days.

Sec. 2. All ordinances or parts of ordinances in conflict herewith are hereby repealed.

Sec. 3. This ordinance shall take immediate effect three days after its approval by the Mayor.
