To the Honorable the Common Council:

Gentlemen—We herewith transmit to your honorable body, Street Opening Assessment Roll number 422 for defraying a part of the expense and cost of taking private property for the opening of a street 86 feet wide, from Main avenue to Conant avenue, where not already opened, as a public street and highway. This roll has been prepared pursuant to and in accordance with the resolution adopted by your honorable body on November 27th, 1923, (J. C. C. Page 2680).

The benefits of the whole property included in the taxing district equals the sums assessed thereon, and the lands included in the said assessment district were assessed in proportion to the benefits specially derived by them from such improvement. The notice required by law has been given to the parties in interest, as will appear by the annexed notice and affidavit of publication. We have therefore signed the same and report it to your honorable body, and herewith present the following resolution to that end.

Resolved, That the Common Council of the City of Detroit do hereby approve and confirm Street Opening Assessment Roll number 422 for defraying part of the expense and cost of taking private property for the opening of a street, 86 feet wide, from Main avenue to Conant avenue, where not already opened, as a public street and highway.

Which said roll has been prepared pursuant to and in accordance with the resolution adopted by the Common Council November 27, 1923, (Page 2680); further resolved, that the description of the premises and the names of persons contained therein are received as correct; that the lots and parcels of land contained therein and the several owners and occupants have been assessed in said roll in proportion to the benefits specially derived by them, and each of them, from the opening of a street 86 feet wide; that the benefits of such improvement to such lots and parcels of land, and the several owners thereof, equals the assessment levied against the property contained in said assessment roll; that the bene-

fits to the whole of the property included in the taxing district equals the sum assessed thereon, and that the sums set forth in the said assessment roll are the correct ones which each lot or parcel of land should be assessed and pay, and that the said assessment upon such lot or parcel of land, be collected from the several persons liable to pay the same according to law, and shall become due and payable within 30 days from the date of the first publication by the City Treasurer of the notice of said assessment.

Gentlemen—We herewith transmit to your Honorable Body assessment rolls numbered 4245 to 4262, both inclusive, for grading and paving the following streets and alleys, to-wit:

Roll No. 4245—Anstell street, from the north curb line of Harper avenue to the south line of Knodell avenue.

Roll No. 4246—Byron avenue, from the north curb line of Pingree avenue to the south line of Hazelwood avenue.

Roll No. 4247—Fourteenth avenue, from the north line of Clairmount avenue to the south line of Longfellow avenue.

Roll No. 4248—Fourteenth avenue, from the north line of Boston boulevard to the south line of Glynn court.

Roll No. 4249—Glenwood avenue, from the east curb line of Gratiot avenue to the west line of Chalmers avenue.

Roll No. 4250—Lakeview avenue, from the north line of Charlevoix street to the south curb line of Mack avenue.

Roll No. 4251—Pasadena avenue, the unpaved portion between Wabash avenue and La Salle avenue.

Roll No. 4252—Pilgrim avenue, from the west line of City of Highland Park to the east line of Twelfth street.

**From the City Plan Commission.**

To the Honorable the Common Council:

Gentlemen—We are enclosing herewith, a plan (No. 470-1) for the opening of Cornwall, Waveney, Huntingdon and Brunswick avenues from their existing termini to Cadieux Road.

You will note that a parcel of property was subdivided some years ago between Warren avenue and Mack avenue, a distance of about three-quarters of a mile, without providing a single cross street.

We are informed that buildings are about to be erected on certain lots affected by these proposed openings and therefore recommend that immediate action be taken towards the condemnation of lots required, being about eight altogether. The greater portion of the property needed for these openings will be dedicated when the property to the east and west is subdivided.
