**AN ORDINANCE** to amend Chapter 35 of the Compiled Ordinances of the City of Detroit, 1920, being an ordinance entitled "An Ordinance to regulate the use by vehicles of the streets, alleys, and public places in the City of Detroit," by amending section 1 of Part IV. thereof.

IT IS HEREBY ORDAINED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE CITY OF DETROIT:

Sec. 1. That an ordinance entitled 2 titled "An Ordinance to regulate 3 late the use of vehicles of the 4 streets, alleys and public places 5 in the City of Detroit," being 6 Chapter 35 of the Compiled Ordinances of the City of Detroit, 1920, by amending Section 1 of Part IV. thereof, be 7 and the same is hereby amended 8 to read as follows: 9

**PART IV.**

Sec. 1. No person shall park 2 any vehicle or permit his vehicle 3 to be parked on the following 4 streets and highways, 5 as provided herein.

6 (a) On any street or highway in 7 the area bounded on the north by 8 the north side of Adams Avenue, 9 on the east by the east side of 10 Randolph street, on the south 11 by the south side of Jefferson 12 Avenue, on the west by the 13 west side of Cass Avenue, from 14 4:30 p. m. to 6:15 p. m.

15 Provided, that the provisions 16 of this subdivision shall not be 17 applicable on the following 18 streets: Cadillac Square, Washington Boulevard, Bagley Avenue, Madison Avenue.

21 (b) On the following streets 22 and highways from 4:30 p. m. 23 to 6:15 p. m.:

24 1. Griswold Street from Jefferson Avenue to Atwater Street.

26 2. Bates Street from Jefferson Avenue to Atwater Street.

28 3. Woodbridge Street from 29 Griswold Street to Bates Street.

31 4. Atwater Street from Griswold Street to Bates Street.

33 5. Fort Street west from Woodward Avenue to West Grand Boulevard.

36 6. Lafayette Boulevard from 37 Griswold Street to West Grand Boulevard.

39 7. Michigan Avenue from 40 Woodward Avenue to West Grand Boulevard.

42 8. Grand River Avenue from 43 Woodward Avenue to West Grand Boulevard.

45 9. Second Avenue from Grand River Avenue to West Grand Boulevard.

48 10. Cass Avenue from Woodward Street to West Grand Boulevard.

51 11. Clifford Street from Woodward Avenue to Cass Avenue.

53 12. Park Avenue from Woodward Avenue to Peterboro Street.

56 13. Woodward Avenue from 57 the River to Grand Boulevard.

58 14. John R Street from Woodward Avenue to East Grand Boulevard.

61 15. Gratiot Avenue from Woodward Avenue to East Grand Boulevard.

64 16. Jefferson Avenue from 65 Woodward Avenue to East Grand Boulevard.

67 Provided, That the provisions 68 of subdivision (b) shall not be 69 applicable to the west side of 70 Woodward Avenue from Jefferson Avenue to the Detroit River.

73 Provided Further, That the 74 provisions of subdivisions (a)

75 and (b) shall not be applicable 76 on Sunday, and legal holidays.

Sec. 2. This ordinance is 2 hereby declared to be immediately 3 necessary for the preservation 4 of the public peace, 5 health and safety and shall be 6 given immediate effect.

**From the Corporation Counsel.**

June 23, 1925.

To the Honorable the Common Council:

Gentlemen—Benj. F. Seidler, et al., vs. City of Detroit, et al. The above entitled cause arose out of the sale of a motor boat on or about the 16th day of June, 1922, which was sold by Mr. J. C. Emery, then connected with this office, on a writ of attachment. The affidavit for the writ of attachment being invalid, it conveyed no jurisdiction upon the court issuing the writ.

Claim was filed with the Common Council in which claimants asked the sum of \$1,200 as the value of the boat, which claim was recommended by this office to be denied because of the fact that we believed the claim to be excessive.

This matter came on for trial and the only question involved when the case was presented to the jury was a question of value, the jury bringing in a verdict of \$1,023.93. No appeal has been taken on this case because of the fact that we believe no grounds for appeal exist. There also has been taxed the sum of \$72.50 costs.

This matter has been taken up with the plaintiff's attorney, who has signified his desire to settle this case for the amount of the judgment, waiving the costs incurred.

We therefore recommend that the necessary resolution be adopted so that the judgment may be paid.
