**AN ORDINANCE to amend Chapter 177, of the Compiled Ordinances of the City of Detroit for the year 1926.**

IT IS HEREBY ORDAINED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE CITY OF DETROIT:

Section 1. That Chapter 177 of the Compiled Ordinances of the City of Detroit for the year 1926, be amended by amending Section thereof, to read as follows:

Section 4. The following roads hereby declared to be boulevards for the purposes of this ordinance and within the meaning of Chapter IX of Title IV of the Charter:

Grand Boulevard—From the mainland terminus of the Belle Isle bridge to the terminus of the Grand Boulevard at the Detroit River.

Arden Park—From Oakland avenue to Woodward avenue.

Boston Boulevard—From Oakland avenue to Linwood avenue.

Cadillac Boulevard—From Jefferson avenue to Mack avenue.

Chicago Boulevard—From Woodward avenue to Linwood avenue.

Dexter Boulevard—From Grand Boulevard to Joy Road.

Lafayette Boulevard—From Woodward street to Green avenue.

LaSalle Boulevard—From Grand Boulevard to Boston boulevard.

Oakman Boulevard—From Twelfth street to the boundary line of the City of Fordson.

Ponchartrain Boulevard—From Mile Road to Palmer Park.

Second Boulevard—From Grand River avenue west to the southern boundary line of the City of Highland Park.

Washington Boulevard—From Michigan avenue to Park street.

Any and all bridges from the mainland to Belle Isle shall, when completed, be deemed to be boulevards within the meaning of this ordinance.

Section 2. All ordinances or parts of ordinances in conflict herewith are hereby repealed.
