

Avenue from Livernois Avenue to Welland Avenue.

This case was tried in the Recorder's Court and the jury returned a verdict of no necessity and added the following notation to their verdict roll:

"It is the opinion of this panel, it is not an immediate necessity to open London Avenue under present conditions until Lot No. 107 Welland Avenue is condemned to make London Avenue connect with Welland Avenue in a uniform way so as not to damage Welland Avenue, and also give the proper benefits to London Avenue and also the City of Detroit at large."

We filed a motion for a new trial which is now pending. This motion may be brought on for hearing at any time, but it may be advisable to change the plans for this opening before the case is tried again.

We therefore respectfully recommend that the matter be referred back to the City Plan Commission and the Condemnation Commission for a report.

Gentlemen—Re: Widening of Gratiot Avenue from Randolph Street to Riopelle Street.

Since the plans of this widening were originally prepared, the Constitutional Amendment providing for Excess Condemnation was adopted. It may be advisable to take advantage of this new law in connection with widening this particular section. Before proceeding further, however, I believe it would be advisable to have a thorough study made.

I therefore respectfully recommend that this matter be referred to the Condemnation Commission for a study and report.
