BY Councilman Hall:

Resolved, That resolution adopted January 7th, 1930 (J. C. C. p. 3642), approving and confirming Street Widening Assessment Roll No. 649 for defraying part of the expense and cost of taking private property for the widening of Mack avenue from Lycaste to St. Jean avenues, be and the same is hereby rescinded, and further

Resolved, That the City Treasurer, upon receipt of new assessment roll for the widening of said street, be and he is hereby authorized and directed to credit each piece or parcel

of real estate appearing thereon with the amount paid on the original roll (No. 649), and further

Resolved, That the Common Council of the City of Detroit hereby determines that the sum of \$253,565.04 is a just proportion of the compensation awarded by the jury for the property taken by the City of Detroit for the widening of Mack ave. from St. Jean ave. to Lycaste ave., where not already widened, as a public street and highway, which should be paid by the owners or occupants of the pieces or parcels of real estate which will thus be benefited by said improvement, which said pieces or parcels of real estate are described in a resolution of the Common Council (J. C. C., p. 314, 1927), wherein the assessment district for this improvement was designated; and be it further

Resolved, That there be assessed and levied upon said pieces or parcels of real estate included in said resolution above referred to, the amount of \$253,565.04 as near as may be, to the advantage which each lot or parcel is deemed to acquire by such improvement; and be it further

Resolved, That the Board of Assessors of the City of Detroit be and they are hereby directed and instructed to proceed forthwith to prepare an assessment roll in conformity with the requirements of the Charter of the City of Detroit relating to special assessments for collecting the expense of public improvements where a street is graded, comprising the property hereinbefore referred to and described in said resolution (J. C. C., p. 314, 1927), upon which they shall assess and levy the amount of \$253,565.04; each lot or parcel to be assessed at a ratable proportion as near as may be of said amount, in accordance with the amount of benefit derived by such improvement; and be it further

Resolved, That the sum of \$253,565.07 of the award of the jury be paid by the City of Detroit out of the Street Opening Fund; and further

Resolved, That said assessment shall be made in eight parts, part one of which shall become due and payable in 30 days after the first publication by the City Treasurer of the notice of such assessment, and further

Resolved, That the Board of Assessors of the City of Detroit be and they are hereby directed in making out said assessment roll for the opening of said Mack avenue to credit each piece or parcel of real estate benefited by such improvement with its proportionate share of 50 per cent or \$662.50 of the total sum of \$1,325.00 received from the sale of buildings condemned in the matter of opening said street, which is the same ratio agreed upon in apportioning the verdict rendered
