From the Corporation Council

To the Honorable, the Common Council:

Gentlemen—In reference to your letter of February 21st, relative to the bids received in connection with the proposed purchase of asphaltic cement, you asked me to submit in writing the verbal opinion given to the Committee of the Whole. As I understand it the question asked is as follows:

Has the Common Council the right to require the Commissioner of Purchases and Supplies to submit the bids received to the Common Council where the bids complied in all respects with the specifications and the article to be furnished meets in all particulars the requirements of the City?

My answer was in the affirmative which I herewith confirm. The Charter sets up no specific procedure in this regard but does provide that all contracts and specifications must be approved by the Common Council. When bids comply with these specifications the Common Council should have the final decision as to whether to accept or reject. If the Common Council did not have this power it would become possible by rejecting bids complying in all respects with the specifications for the Department of Purchases and Supplies to prevent the Council from entering into a contract for articles they desire to acquire.

When bids are received complying with the advertised specifications these bids should be submitted to the Common Council, and if, in the opinion of the Commissioner, reasons exist why some should be rejected, such a recommendation should accompany the bids. The Council is then in a position to either reject or accept the lowest bid.

If, however, the bids do not comply with the specifications the Commissioner has the right to reject same without submission of the bids to the
