Street Openings—Hayes Ave.

To the Honorable, the Common Council:

Gentlemen—To your Committee of the Whole was referred the matter of levying the assessment for the widening of Hayes avenue immediately north and south of Coram avenue, the property for said widening having been acquired by direct purchase.

Your Committee begs to report that we have had the matter under consideration, and are satisfied that the property in the vicinity is largely benefited by same and should therefore bear a portion of the expense. The cost of the improvement was \$7,800.00, and we recommend that 66 2-3 per cent or \$5,200.00 be assessed on the local assessment district, and that the remaining portion, viz., 33 1-3 per cent or \$2,600.00, be paid by the City of Detroit out of the

Street Opening Fund, and therefore offer the following resolution.
