AN ORDINANCE changing the names of certain streets and highways in the City of Detroit.

IT IS HEREBY ORDAINED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE CITY OF DETROIT.

Section 1. That the name of the 2 street and highway known as Welland Avenue from the Six Mile Road north to the City Limits, be and the same is hereby changed to 2 and shall hereafter be known as 7 San Juan Drive, and that the name 8 of the street and highway known 9 as Wark Avenue from the Six Mile 10 Road north to the City Limits, 11 be and the same is hereby changed 12 to and shall hereafter be known 13 as Santa Rosa Drive.

Sec. 2. All ordinances or parts 2 of ordinances in conflict herewith 3 are hereby repealed.
