

COMMON COUNCIL

(OFFICIAL)

Detroit, Tuesday, March 21, 1933.

The Council met and was called to order by the President, Hon. Frank Couzens.

SUBSTITUTE ORDINANCE

By Councilman Van Antwerp:

AN ORDINANCE to amend Chapter 177 of the Compiled Ordinances of the City of Detroit for the year 1926.

IT IS HEREBY ORDAINED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE CITY OF DETROIT:

Section 1. That Chapter 177 of the 2 the Compiled Ordinances of the 3 City of Detroit for the year 1926 4 be amended by amending Section 5 4 thereof to read as follows:
