Sec. 2. All ordinances or parts 2 of ordinances in conflict herewith 3 are hereby repealed.

Read twice by title, ordered printed and laid on the table.

Councilman Bradley asked for the privilege of the floor, and made the following remarks.

Mr. President—I notice that our Presiding Officer is attired in a sombre suit of clothes. I called his attention to this fact once before and he explained that he had to go out to a dinner. He has been honest and courageous, and it is my hope, and I am sure that I express the hope of all the other members of the Common Council, when I say, that may all his endeavors in the future be crowned with the same success that they have been while he has been President of the Common Council.

Mr. Lodge then asked that the members of the Council give expression of their approval of these remarks by a rising vote, which was unanimously complied with.

And the Council then adjourned until 7:00 p. m. Thursday, May 4, 1933.

ORDINANCE NO. 231-C

AN ORDINANCE to amend Section 7 of Chapter 177 of the Compiled Ordinances of the City of Detroit for the year 1926.

IT IS HEREBY ORDAINED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE CITY OF DETROIT:

Section 1. That Chapter 177 of the Compiled Ordinances of the City of Detroit for the year 1926 be amended by amending Section 4 thereof to read as follows:

Sec. 4. The following named streets from lot line to lot line are hereby declared to be Boulevards for the purposes of this ordinance and in the meaning of Chapter 177, Title IV of the Charter.

Arden Park—From Oakland Avenue to Woodward Avenue.

Boston Boulevard—From Dearborn Avenue to Livernois Avenue.

Broadstreet Boulevard—From Madison Avenue to Cortland Avenue.

Cadillac Boulevard—From Mack Avenue to Mack Avenue.

Chicago Boulevard—From Woodward Avenue to Linwood Avenue.

Dexter Boulevard—From Grand Boulevard to Joy Road.

Grand Boulevard—From the land terminus of the Belle Isle to the terminus of the West Boulevard at the Detroit River.

Lafayette Boulevard—From Wold Street to Green Avenue.

La Salle Boulevard—From Boston Boulevard to Boston Boulevard.

Oakman Boulevard—From the boundary line of Highland Park to the boundary line of the City of Dearborn.

Oakman Court—From Dearborn Avenue to Oakman Boulevard.

Pontchartrain Boulevard—From Mile Road to Palmer Park.

Riverside Drive—From East Boulevard to Baldwin Avenue.

Second Boulevard—From the River Avenue West to Southern boundary line of the City of Dearborn.

Washington Boulevard—From Michigan Avenue to Park Avenue.

Any and all bridges from the land to Belle Isle shall, when completed, be deemed to be Boulevards within the meaning of this ordinance.

Sec. 2. All ordinances or parts of ordinances in conflict herewith are hereby repealed.

ORDINANCE No. 199-C

AN ORDINANCE to amend Section 2 of Chapter 70 of the Compiled Ordinances of the City of Detroit.

IT IS HEREBY ORDAINED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE CITY OF DETROIT:

Section 1. That Section 2 of Chapter 70 of the Compiled Ordinances of the City of Detroit, be and the same is hereby amended to read as follows:

Sec. 2. The license fee upon a license for a circus or open-air exhibition, commonly known as "shows" where an admission fee is charged, shall be Two Hundred (\$200.00) Dollars for the first day upon which an exhibition shall occur, and Two Hundred (\$200.00) Dollars for each subsequent day. The license fee for a menagerie where a like admission fee is charged, shall be One Hundred (\$100.00) Dollars for the first day on which an exhibition shall occur and One Hundred (\$100.00) Dollars for each subsequent day.

For shows and menageries combined, where two admission fees of thirty-five (35) cents or more are charged, the license fee shall be Three Hundred (\$300.00) Dollars for the first day upon which an exhibition shall occur, and Three Hundred (\$300.00) Dollars for each subsequent day.

Exhibitions which are commonly known as "side shows," when given in connection with circuses and menageries, as specified above, and on the same day, shall be interpreted to mean two admission fees under this ordinance.

Sec. 1. All ordinances or parts of ordinances in conflict herewith are hereby repealed.

AN ORDINANCE to amend Section 7 of Chapter 72 of the Compiled Ordinances of the City of Detroit.

IT IS HEREBY ORDAINED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE CITY OF DETROIT:

Section 1. That Section 7 of Chapter 72 of the Compiled Ordinances of the City of Detroit, 1926,

be and the same is hereby amended to read as follows:

Sec. 7. Each person, society, club, firm or corporation to whom license is granted shall pay an annual fee therefor in the sum of Five (\$5.00) Dollars for the first billiard table and Fifteen (\$15.00) Dollars for the first bowling alley and Fifty (50c) Cents for each additional billiard table and Three (\$3.00) Dollars for each additional bowling alley. All money received by way of said license fee shall be paid into the Recreation Fund of the City of Detroit.

Sec. 2. All ordinances or parts of ordinances in conflict herewith are hereby repealed.

ORDINANCE No. 197-C

AN ORDINANCE to amend Section 7 of Chapter 144 of the Compiled Ordinances of the City of Detroit, 1926.

IT IS HEREBY ORDAINED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE CITY OF DETROIT:

Section 1. That Section 7 of Chapter 144 of the Compiled Ordinances of the City of Detroit, 1926, be and the same is hereby amended to read as follows:

Section 7. A fee of Ten (\$10.00) Dollars shall be charged for each wagon license so granted, and the fee of Two (\$2.00) Dollars shall be charged for each store or restaurant license so granted, which fee shall be paid before said license is granted. It shall be the duty of the City Treasurer to turn into the Public Health Fund of said City all moneys so received for the licensing of persons engaged in the distribution and sale of milk, such moneys to be used by said Department in the enforcement and carrying out of the provisions of this ordinance.

Sec. 2. All ordinances or parts of ordinances in conflict herewith are hereby repealed.
