Sec. 4. No person shall remove  
2 any fixtures, plumbing articles,  
3 chandeliers, or similar appliances  
4 or appurtenances from any struc-  
5 ture in the City of Detroit with-  
6 out first securing a permit from  
7 the Department of Buildings and  
8 Safety Engineering of the City of  
9 Detroit. Such permit shall be is-  
10 sued by the Department of Build-  
11 ings and Safety Engineering upon  
12 proper application, giving the name  
13 and address of the applicant, the  
14 owner's name, the address of the  
15 structure from which such fixtures,  
16 plumbing articles, chandeliers or  
17 similar appliances or appurten-  
18 ances are to be removed and con-  
19 taining such other information as  
20 may be required by the Commis-  
21 sioner of the Department of Build-  
22 ings and Safety Engineering. Each  
23 applicant shall pay a fee to the  
24 Department of Buildings and  
25 Safety Engineering of Fifty cents  
26 (50c) and each applicant shall be  
27 furnished proper tags or stickers  
28 which shall be affixed to each ar-  
29 ticle to be removed from such  
30 structure.

Sec. 5. Every person so licensed  
2 shall keep a book in which shall  
3 be written in ink at the time of  
4 the purchase of any house wreck-  
5 ing material, second hand build-  
6 ing material, or second hand  
7 building and household appliances  
8 and appurtenances a complete de-  
9 scription of the person or persons  
10 from whom such purchase was  
11 made, which description shall con-  
12 tain the name, street address,  
13 color, age, height and weight of  
14 such person and the date and hour  
15 of such purchase and the delivery  
16 vehicle license number and the  
17 number of the removal permit is-  
18 sued by the Department of Build-  
19 ings and Safety Engineering of the  
20 City of Detroit. Such book shall  
21 at all times be open to the in-  
22 spection of any member of the  
23 police force of the City of Detroit.  
24 Such book shall be substantially  
25 bound, and of a size not less than  
26 six inches in length and breadth,  
27 and which shall have legibly writ-  
28 ten in the English language the  
29 amount paid for each article pur-  
30 chased. No entry in such book  
31 shall be erased, obliterated, altered  
32 or defaced.

Sec. 6. It shall be unlawful to  
2 sell or purchase any household ap-  
3 pliances or appurtenances, such as  
4 second hand plumbing articles or  
5 material, chandeliers and similar  
6 fixtures, unless the identification  
7 tag or sticker issued by the De-

partment of Buildings and  
9 Engineering is affixed to each  
10 such articles.

Sec. 7. Every  
2 dealer shall make out  
3 day before the hour of  
4 on blank forms to be  
5 the Police Department

Sec. 12. No person  
2 der the provisions of  
3 ance shall purchase  
4 wrecking material, second  
5 building material, and second  
6 building and household  
7 and appurtenances from  
8 son who is at the time  
9 or under the influence of  
10 tics, or from a habitual  
11 or narcotic addict, or  
12 known by him to be a  
13 associate of

of stolen property, or from  
any person he has reason to sus-  
pect of such.

The provisions of this  
ordinance shall not apply to per-  
sons engaged in the business of  
removing whole structures and dis-  
posing of the materials secured  
during the wrecking of such  
structures and who are li-  
censed as house wreckers.

Any person, firm or  
corporation violating any of the  
provisions of this ordinance shall,  
in addition to the penalty herein  
provided therefor, be sub-  
jected to a fine not exceeding the  
sum of Five Hundred (\$500) Dol-  
lars or imprisonment in the De-  
partment of Correction for a  
term not exceeding ninety (90)  
days, or both such fine and im-  
prisonment in the discretion of  
the court.

All ordinances or parts  
of ordinances in conflict herewith  
are hereby repealed.

IT IS HEREBY ORDAINED BY THE  
PEOPLE OF THE CITY OF DETROIT:

Section 1. That the name of the  
2 street and highway now known as  
3 the Six Mile Road, from Woodward  
4 Avenue to Grand River Avenue, in  
5 the City of Detroit, be and the  
6 same is hereby changed and shall  
7 hereafter be known as McNichols  
8 Road.

Sec. 2. All ordinances or parts  
2 of ordinances in conflict herewith  
3 are hereby repealed.

The ordinance as amended was  
then placed on the order of third  
reading.

Third Reading of Ordinance
