Gentlemen—The following em-  
ployees of the City of Detroit were  
injured while in the course of their  
employment:

Ambrose Clavenna, employee De-  
partment of Water Supply; Fred Wag-  
ner, Lyle McCracken, Jules Desnet,  
William Carpenter and Joseph Gad-  
wa, employees Department of Street  
Railways.

Under the terms of the Michigan  
Workmen's Compensation Law, the  
employer shall pay the injured em-  
ployees at the rate of 66 2-3 per cent  
of their average weekly wages, not  
to exceed \$18 per week, nor more  
than 500 weeks from the date of in-  
jury. To the end that the above be  
paid, we suggest the adoption of the  
following resolution.
