ORDINANCE No. 303-C (Insert opposite page 591)

AN ORDINANCE to Amend Ordinance 292-C of the Ordinances of the City of Detroit being "An Ordinance to prohibit smoking in all theatres in the City of Detroit."

IT IS HEREBY ORDAINED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE CITY OF DETROIT:

Section 1. No smoking shall hereafter be permitted in any theatre in the City of Detroit.

Sec. 2. Any theatre owner, proprietor, lessee or manager permitting smoking in his theatre shall be subject, upon conviction therefor, to a fine of not over \$100.00, or imprisonment not exceeding thirty days in the Detroit House of Correction, or by both such fine and imprisonment in the discretion of the Court.

Sec. 3. All ordinances or parts of ordinances in conflict herewith are hereby repealed.
