Gentlemen—The following employees of the City of Detroit were injured while in the course of their employment:

Jackson Reese and William Fox, employees Department of Public Works; Joseph Hillger and Louis

Garavaglia, employees Board of Water Commissioners; Nick Guseil, employee Department Parks and Boulevards; Joseph Olszewski and Oscar Pinion, employees Department of Street Railways.

Under the terms of the Michigan Workmen's Compensation Law, the employer shall pay the injured employees at the rate of 66 2/3 per cent of their average weekly wages, not to exceed \$18 per week, nor more than 500 weeks from the date of injury. To the end that the above be paid, we suggest the adoption of the following resolution.

From the Corporation Counsel

July 25, 1939.

To the Honorable, the Common Council:

Gentlemen—The Board of County Road Commissioners of Wayne County have transmitted to your Honorable Body a copy of a proposed agreement between said Board and the City of Detroit for participation in the cost of widening and improving Michigan Avenue from Sixth Street to Fourteenth Street; and Gratiot Avenue from Townsend Avenue to Harper Avenue. The condemnation verdicts on these streets, in the districts mentioned, have already been returned and confirmed.

The proposed agreement is to advance to the City of Detroit the total sum of \$962,835.04 for the following purposes:

- (a) To reimburse the City for funds advanced by the City to pay the City's share of such condemnation awards on Gratiot Avenue from Townsend Avenue to Harper Avenue.
- (b) To pay the City's share of condemnation awards on Gratiot Avenue
