ORDINANCE No. 47-D

AN ORDINANCE to amend Section 1 of Chapter 60 of the Compiled Ordinances of the City of Detroit, 1936.

IT IS HEREBY ORDAINED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE CITY OF DETROIT:

Section 1. That Section 1 of Chapter 60 of the Compiled Ordinances of the City of Detroit, 1936, be and the same is hereby amended to read as follows:

Sec. 1. It shall be unlawful for any person, firm or corporation to sell, furnish or give away directly or indirectly, cigarettes or the component parts thereof without first obtaining a license from the Mayor. The Mayor is hereby authorized to issue licenses to any person, firm or corporation, desiring to sell cigarettes upon application setting forth the full name and place or places of business in which it is proposed to carry on the sale of cigarettes or the component parts thereof, or to refuse to issue said licenses or to revoke same upon satisfactory proof that the applicant has been convicted of violating any law of this State, the United States, or ordinances of the City of Detroit, or has violated any of the terms of this ordinance or has been convicted of a felony, or if the Mayor shall, upon investigation, obtain information from any reliable source which shows that the applicant is of good character and reputation and unsuitable to be entrusted with the sale of cigarettes or the component parts thereof. If the Mayor be satisfied after such investigation and the obtaining of information from any reliable source that the applicant is a suitable person to have said license, he may issue such license upon payment to the City Treasurer of a license fee of \$1.00. Any violation of the provisions of this section shall be punishable, upon conviction, by a fine not to exceed the Hundred (\$100.00) Dollars or imprisonment in the Detroit House of Correction for a period not to exceed ninety (90) days, or both such fine and imprisonment in the discretion of the Court.

Sec. 2. All ordinances or parts of ordinances in conflict herewith are hereby repealed.

Sec. 3. This ordinance is declared to be necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health and safety, and is hereby given immediate effect.

ORDINANCE No. 53-D

(File in container and make notation at Sec. 65 on page 474)

AN ORDINANCE to amend Chapter 196 of the Compiled Ordinances of the City of Detroit, 1936, by adding a new section to said chapter to be known as Section 65 (b).

IT IS HEREBY ORDAINED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE CITY OF DETROIT:

Section 1. That Chapter 196 of the Compiled Ordinances of the City of Detroit, 1936, be and the same is hereby amended by adding a new section to said chapter to be known as section 65 (b), reading as follows:

Section 65 (b). In any proceeding for violation of the parking provisions of this chapter, being sections 53 to 65, inclusive, of Chapter 196 of the Compiled Ordinances of the City of Detroit for the year 1936, and amendments thereto, or any rule or regulation adopted pursuant to the provisions of said chapter the registration plate displayed on such motor vehicle shall constitute in evidence a prima facie presumption that the owner of such motor vehicle was the person who parked or placed such motor vehicle at the point where such violation occurred.

Sec. 2. All ordinances or parts of ordinances in conflict herewith are hereby repealed.

Sec. 3. This ordinance is hereby declared to be immediately necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health, and safety and shall be given immediate effect.
