Gentlemen—Some time ago your Honorable Body directed the razing of a structure at 5772 Lincoln Ave. This frame dwelling was condemned by the Department of Building and Safety Engineering. At the time that the order was issued the building was occupied by one Daniel Maloney. He has since been transferred to Eloise but considerable dilapidated furniture and furnishing are still on the premises.

As the building is now in a very bad condition we are anxious to tear it down immediately. Mr Maloney is 86 years old and very confused according to the report from Eloise, but as far as we have been able to go, has no relatives.
