Resolved, That all of "L" alley block bounded by Strathmoor, Mark Twain, Plymouth and Capitol Avenues more particularly described as all east and west public alley 18 feet wide lying between the southern line of the northerly 22 feet of Lot 75 of New Plymouth Road Subdivision of Lots 7, 8, 9, 10, 11, 12, 26, 27, 28, 29 and 30 of Frischkorn Grand River Farms Sub. of W. ½ of W. ½ of S. E. ¼ Sec. 30, T. 1 S. R. 11 E., Greenfield Township, Wayne County, Michigan, as recorded in Liber 46 Page 93 of Plats of Wayne County Records and the northern line of Lot 74 of last mentioned Subdivision (being the same property described in Deed to the City of Detroit and recorded in Liber 544 Page 454 of Deeds of Wayne County Records).

Also all of north and south public alley 18 feet wide lying between the easterly line of the southerly 18 feet of Lot 55, the easterly line of Lot 56, 57, 58 and the westerly line of Lots 72, 73, 74; the westerly line east and west public alley heretofore described all of last mentioned Subdivision.

Provided, Petitioners reimburse owners to the extent of the cost of any utilities now installed in said alley which it may be necessary to abandon due to the closing of said alley or bear the entire expense of relocating or rerouting any public utilities now installed in said alley which it may be necessary to relocate or reroute due to the closing of same, and further

Resolved, That the City Controller be and he is hereby directed to Quit Claim Deed to Nash Kelvinator Corporation, a Maryland Corporation of Detroit, Michigan, as owners fee of adjoining property.
